Microchipping is technology for identifying your pet if he/she ever gets lost. The process is done by a veterinarian who injects a rice-grain-sized chip under your pet's skin. If your dog or cat ever gets lost, a shelter or vet can scan the chip and identify you as the owner. If you have adopted from Norcal Golden Retriever Rescue, you may want to include our hotline number as a backup phone number (650) 615-6810.

When we lost our "Kandas" of 15 years, our hearts were broken, and our home felt incomplete without a dog. After researching the internet, we stumbled upon NGRR and were drawn to golden rescues. We thought fostering would be a great start. We envisioned lots of goldens coming through our door and along the

Charlie was a little shy when he first came to us. He had been a backyard dog for the past two years and had not been to the vet for two years. We took him to the vet for a full physical. He had a urinary tract infection and was 15 pounds overweight. We got him on medication to rid him of his urinary tract infection, brought him current on his shots, had his teeth cleaned, put him on a preventative heartworm and flea/tick program, and had him tested for any thyroid problems. He is now on thyroid medication (no big deal – one pill a day with his meal). With adjustments to his diet and a much more



active lifestyle, he has been shaving off those pounds. He does step-aerobics at least 10 times a day in his 2-story home and gets daily walks around the community park. He also has an annual pass to the dog park in the foothills where he loves running with other furry friends and chasing after balls and frisbees.

I called immediately. Bob and I had always had rescue goldens. Our companions had given us so much and changed our lives; it was our time to give back. The only problem – Bob didn't even know I had signed us up, and suddenly our first foster arrived. Was he upset – NO! It was the cutest thing – with all our Fosters, he gave each prospective adoptive family the third degree – just like a father whose daughter is going on a first date. When they were adopted I would cry and he would

comfort me, reassuring me that NORCAL and we had helped

provide THE best families for our little treasures.

One day I got a call that a goldie needed a foster home. No problem. When Linda Knowles dropped him off our mouths dropped, this was the biggest golden in history. As always, we received many calls from prospective adoptive families and when we told them that he weighed in at 150 pounds, we got the same response..."If we wanted a dog that big we would have gotten a Saint Bernard!" So "Bubby," as Bob named him, stayed with us for quite a while. Then, good friends of our family decided they liked "Bubby" and wanted to adopt him. Everything was in place, but at the last minute it wasn't Bob consoling me - Bob just suddenly said no. "Bubby" was part of our family and that was that. We would adopt him.

Within just a few months we lost both our other two goldens – Chelsea & "Bear-Bear" to cancer. The loss of our two 'children' was simply heart wrenching and they are still thought of each day. But who pulled us through? "Bubby." He knew our pain and was such a great comfort.

Around this time, a friend of ours who is a loving breeder of golden retrievers and our long-time pet-sitter was also mourning our loss. At Christmas that same year he so very generously

On February 27, 2003, Bob, my husband and my soul of 22 years, died of a sudden heart attack. He was only 43. It has been a year since his death and I have seen the darkest of days no one could imagine. As I write this tears come to my eyes as they do each and every day. It wasn't until I saw a request for an article that I realized there was more to the story. I lost myself and my hopes and dreams in a second. Financially, I will probably lose the home Bob and I worked so hard to get. Although loved, family and friends think you can just move on. It is an easy thing to say, but really you have to be there to understand it. So what has kept me going . . . our goldens, "Bubby" and "Mandie."

"Bubby" and "Mandie" were profoundly affected as well. They felt the loss of Bob as much as I did. Yet even as they processed their own grief, "Bubby" and "Mandie's" greatest concern was, and is, still me. They sleep right next to me. Every morning when I think I can't make it, I am greeted with such profound joy, "Hey, feed us and let's go on an adventure!" Each time I come home they tell me, "Oh my how we missed you!" It doesn't matter, at play or at home, they look at me and like no one else, they fill my heart with hope.

I write this in honor of my late husband Bob who cherished each smile and lick our goldens and fosters bestowed on him and how he gave from his genuine heart to those dogs who came to us in need. And, most importantly, how somehow he still lives through "Mandie" and "Bubby," giving me the love I need to go on.

I can't help but think that in a previous life Bob was a golden retriever. Lastly, my thanks to our friends at NGRR who have been so supportive – and to the rescue dogs who have changed my life!

"Sam." We humans weren't sure we were quite ready for a new dog. We felt guilty about giving our hearts to someone new. We were afraid any new dog would disappoint us. As a compromise, we decided to look into the Norcal Golden Retriever Rescue Program to become foster parents and perhaps later on, adoptive parents. We completed the process and necessary inspections to qualify as foster parents and prospective adoptive parents.

One Friday afternoon we got the call. But it wasn't exactly what we expected.

### NORCAL Golden Retriever Rescue, Inc.

**Purpose:** NORCAL Golden Retriever Rescue, Inc. (NGRR) is a nonprofit, volunteer organization dedicated to the rescue, rehabilitation, and placement of displaced Golden Retrievers in Northern California.

**Volunteers:** NGRR has a large network of volunteers in communities throughout Northern California. Among these are a board of directors and numerous area coordinators and foster families who care for and place over 400 Goldens a year into new homes. Our volunteers do not receive any form of compensation for their time and effort.

**Articles:** Articles and news items of general informational, educational, or human interest are welcome. We especially

like to hear and see (send photos) how our rescued Goldens are doing with their new owners. If submitting a reprint of an article from another publication, please obtain prior permission from the publisher. Permission to reprint any material in this newsletter should be obtained from the author, crediting NGRR.

**Mailing List:** This newsletter is mailed to all persons and businesses who have adopted a dog or donated money, time, services, or auction items to NGRR within the past two years. It is also mailed to members of the NORCAL Golden Retriever Breed Club, officers of the Golden Retriever Club of America, and other animal rescue groups. We do not share our mailing list with other organizations. It was about adopting a dog. A family in the South Bay surrendered their threeyear-old golden retriever. We thought, how lucky for us, to be called about such a young, trained, beautiful Golden. So, we raced to the Norcal volunteer's house with our other Golden "McKenzie" and met "Nick" (formerly Nico). "Nick" seemed to be the perfect fit and we knew that we needed to make a decision quickly or another family would certainly take him right away. So we decided to take him home, mostly because "McKenzie" loved him and even acted like they had met previously.

When we arrived home we realized that "Nick" had the same birth date as "Sam" and we thought, wow, what a funny coincidence. The next day we were looking over more of "Nick's" paper work and much to our disbelief and amazement, it turned out that "Nick" was "Sam's" brother. They were littermates!

Three years later, many miles and cities away from their original birthplace, destiny united us with "Sam's" brother. It was meant to be. Sometimes we even think that "Sam" knew "Nick" needed a new home and somehow arranged our meeting. We know that "Sam" is smiling down on us from doggie heaven, as he sees our home being taken over by his brother "Nick." We know he laughs when he watches the dog take over the couch while the humans sit on the floor, when he sees "Nick" taking up three-quarters of the king-size bed and the humans trying to sleep on the remaining 18 inches, or when he sees us scramble to make sure that there's nothing on the kitchen counter that looks like, smells like, or once may have been food! All traits of "Sam."

Having "Sam's" brother come into our lives made it easier to deal with his loss. Oh brother it's a small world!

# Working Towards a CANCER CURE

I adopted my beloved boy, Skipper, at the ripe old age of 10 through NGRR. He is now  $14 \frac{1}{2}$  going on 3. He was the second dog surrendered to me and he got along so well with the female I already had - he stayed. Haven't we all said this so many times? In my opinion, there is not a better dog on this earth than Skipper (okay maybe Summer or Mikey). His manners make the foster dogs look like hoodlums. He won't walk through a door without me telling him it is okay. He waits for me to tell him it is okay to eat very contrary to the others I have! He is the epitome of a regal golden. Tall with a dark red curly coat and just prances when he walks.

In July 2003, Skipper developed a very fast growing tumor in his mouth around his gum region. It was determined, much to my dismay, that it was oral malignant melanoma. I was devastated. Although, as an Area Coordinator for Norcal. I hear so much about cancer. it had not personally affected me yet.

The tumor was growing so rapidly that surgery was rushed. My Vet came in on his day off just to get it done. By the time this surgical site was barely healed, another tumor appeared on the opposite side of his mouth. Still in the gum region, I thought "okay 1 more surgery and that is it." So in October 2003, Skipper had the second tumor removed. There were more complications with this one. It was deeper and the Vet had to remove more tissue to get clean margins. I now started worrying about metastasis. How far had it spread? He ended up with a hole in his muzzle from the second surgery and we still are looking for the perfect earring!

Right around Thanksgiving I noticed another tumor developing on the original side. But this time it was in an area that was not operable. My heart sank. At the same time I was going through a divorce - I couldn't bear losing my Skipper,

Skibbo, Bip – all my names for him. My Vet and I discussed all of the options. We discussed quality of life, pain, and appetite. All were normal. We discussed the costs. The two surgeries had already seriously dented the woobie budget. We decided to find out more about this clinical trial for malignant melanoma. The first we heard back was discouraging. I would have to take him to the Bay Area. With all I had going on – I could not commit to running him back and forth from Monterey to a specialist for treatment. Even the specialist in Santa Cruz would be a tough drive for me. With the specialist and the donation for the vaccine - it possibly was too expensive for me to handle.

Upon the graciousness and flexibility of the Colorado University Team, they allowed us to enter the clinical trial. It is a series of 7-8 injections given over a 20week period. Chest x-rays and abdominal ultrasound were performed and thankfully the melanoma had not spread. Whew!! We started the injections immediately. The first 5 injections are every two weeks and then monthly afterward. Skipper had his first injection in January and has had 4 injections to-date. There were some side effects with the first two doses that the University had not seen but I see it as extremely positive. The site where the tumor is would start swelling and be 'active' (that cancer smell), then when it was over, the tumor was smaller and the smell gone. This vaccine was actually attacking the existing tumor!!! The tumor is almost gone now.

This vaccine is not a medicine - it is a DNA based vaccine. It is formulated for dogs that have already shown metastasis but I wanted to STOP it before it metastasized.

I can't tell this University how grateful I am that they are doing this research. Had it not been for this clinical trial and our participation in it, I am certain I would have had to put Skipper down by now. The tumors were growing that fast. Quality of



life would have been an issue. If this dog could not have a tennis ball in his mouth – why live?

Skipper was very mellow for a few months . . . we had "the talk" and I told him to let me know when he was ready to go. He had never acted like a senior golden but he was showing definite signs of age and distress. Not anymore!!! He is back to chasing his tail daily, running for the ball, harassing his "harem" (3 female goldens I have also) and just loving life again. He is goofy, talkative and tearing apart woobies again. It is challenging to keep the weight on him since his mouth has been invaded so much but he really likes biscuits and gravy!

### Donating to NGRR

Since our organization is staffed entirely by volunteers, every penny of your contribution will help pay for veterinary care, food and other direct expenses required in our work to rescue and find loving homes for hundreds of Golden Retrievers each year.

### Gifts by Check or Credit Card

A gift by check or credit card may be made outright or as a pledge to be fulfilled over a period of up to five years. If you itemize tax deductions, your contribution is fully deductible up to 50% of your adjusted gross income; any excess can be carried forward for up to five additional years. ### General Fund

Contributions to this fund will pay for ordinary veterinary care, food and other expenses directly related to our Goldens in foster care. Any excess monies in this fund are allocated to NGRR's emergency reserve to help cover catastrophic events, such as earthquakes and puppy mill raids, in communities throughout Northern California.

#### Senior Goldens

Contributions to this fund will be used exclusively to support the extra veterinary and foster care usually required for dogs eight years and older – our well-deserving Golden Oldies.

### Zack's Fund

Inspired by "Zack," a severely dysplastic Golden taken in and treated by NGRR, this fund was established to provide extensive veterinary care, surgery and rehabilitation to young and deserving Goldens who are critically ill, deformed and/or injured. These dogs need immediate access to funds to restore their quality of life – and, in extreme cases, to save their lives – without financially burdening their adoptive families.
