Under Dr. Heermance's care, Copper underwent multiple tests to determine the cause of his rapid decline. His condition worsened, and he required blood transfusions to stabilize. After extensive diagnostics, Dr. Heermance identified the culprit was a congenital liver shunt, a rare and serious condition where the blood bypasses the liver, preventing it from properly filtering toxins. Without surgery, Copper's chances were slim.

Liver shunt surgery is highly specialized, and luckily, with Norcal's Compassion Care program, Copper was referred to UC Davis Veterinary Hospital. The stakes were high, but Copper was ready for the challenge. Thanks to the UC Davis surgeon and team, Copper recovered from surgery like a champ.

Today, Copper is back home and thriving. His energy levels have soared, his growth is right on track, and his zest for life is contagious. He's a whole new pup, finally able to enjoy his puppyhood the way every Golden Retriever should—stealing socks and rugs, wagging his tail, and stealing hearts wherever he goes.

Simple Low-Calorie, Healthy Dog Treat Suggestions

The lowest-calorie dog treats are fresh vegetables, such as green beans, carrots, and pieces of banana and cucumbers, as well as some fruits like apples, watermelon (my personal favorite), and blueberries. 

Golden Weight Management



Dear Abby-Gold

Q: Our Golden keeps getting fatter. We know it's not healthy. What suggestions can you give us to keep her at a reasonable weight?

A: Those big sorrowful brown eyes! That sad face. Goldens are clever about enticing you to give yet more treats.

Treats can just as easily be satisfying if cut into very small pieces. Instead of a large milk bone, small training treats can be offered. In fact, asking frequently for requested behaviors like sit, stay, come and down can increase your bond with your dog, and rewarding with tiny treats will not affect their weight if you monitor how much they are being fed.

Establish a regular feeding routine, and if you do plan to give treats, be sure to reduce the amount of dog food you actually feed. Feeding table scraps at the table or even later is a recipe for weight gain.

Check with your vet for recommendations for lower calorie food. Many vegetables can help add bulk to their food without adding many calories. Most Goldens love broccoli, carrots and any sort of squash, and canned pumpkin can also be mixed with their food to add extra bulk.

Lastly, remember the importance of exercise for maintaining a healthy weight. Hire or recruit a volunteer dog walker if you are unable to do this yourself. Encourage your Golden to enjoy chasing thrown toys, or in your backyard, you and a buddy can call her to run happily back and forth between both of you. Give your Golden as many choices to be active as possible.
